

# A Journey to the Truth: Embracing Christ's Love

## Opening Scene:

- o Seven individuals (Persons 1 to 7) standing in the center, representing those who are Christians.
- o Fourteen others (Persons 8 to 21) are positioned on the left and right sides, representing those with common objections to following Christ.
- o Children are with their parents, ready to follow them to join the center or join in the final hymn.

Person 1 steps forward from the center.

*Zack*  
Person 1: Welcome, friends! Tonight, we reflect on man's journey to seek and find Christ, and the challenges we all face along the way.

## Dialogue #1: Trust in God's Provision

Persons 8 and 9 step forward from the sides.

*Scott*  
Person 8: I'm struggling to survive. How can I trust that God will provide for me?

*Tracy*  
Person 9: Yes, we worry every day about our basic needs.

Person 2 from the center steps forward.

*KAT*  
Person 2: Jesus reminds us, "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" (Matthew 6:26). Trust in God's provision.

Persons 8 and 9 move to the centre, nodding thoughtfully.

## Dialogue #2: Healing Relationships

Persons 10 and 11 step forward.

*Fred*  
Person 10: My relationships are broken. I don't know how to fix them.

*Ronda*  
Person 11: I've been hurt deeply. Forgiveness seems impossible.

Person 3 from the center steps forward.

*Austin*  
Person 3: Jesus teaches us, "Forgive, and you will be forgiven" (Luke 6:37). Reach out in repentance for your sins and confess that Jesus is Lord, and God will forgive you in His mercy. This transformation in our lives empowers us to forgive others so that we can heal and restore our relationships.

Persons 10 and 11 move to the centre, nodding thoughtfully.

### Dialogue #3: Community and Unity

Persons 12 and 13 step forward.

*Andri*  
Person 12: I feel disconnected from others. How can I make a difference?

*Sonatha*  
Person 13: I'm afraid my actions won't matter in my community.

Person 4 from the center steps forward.

*Grant*  
Person 4: Jesus said, "You are the light of the world... let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16). Through humble service from a transformed heart, we can obey Jesus' greatest command by first loving the Lord with all our hearts, and second, loving our neighbour as ourselves.

Persons 12 and 13 move to the center, nodding thoughtfully

### Dialogue #4: Unconditional Love

Persons 14 and 15 step forward.

Person 14: I find it hard to love those who have wronged me.

*Caldor*  
Person 15: How can I show love to everyone, even those I dislike?

Person 5 from the center steps forward.

*k.m*  
Person 5: Jesus told us, "Love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High." (Luke 6:35). As a believer who has personally experienced the redeeming love of God, demonstrate the same love to others – even your enemies!

Persons 14 and 15 move to the center, nodding thoughtfully

### Dialogue #5: Speaking Truth in Love

Persons 16 and 17 step forward.

*Ryan*  
Person 16: I'm afraid to speak about my faith. What if others reject me?

*Sandra*  
Person 17: I don't know how to share the truth with clarity and courage.

Person 6 from the center steps forward.

*Zoyce*  
Person 6: Jesus said, "So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in

heaven." (Matthew 10:32-33). Christians will be given the courage to share the gospel with others with a promise that Jesus will confess our name before His Father. As we share truth with others, we can experience God's delight in us!

Persons 16 and 17 move to the center, nodding thoughtfully

### **Dialogue #6: Vision of Faith**

Persons 18 and 19 step forward.

*Arlis* Person 18: I can't see God's plan for me. I struggle to have faith.

*Lise* Person 19: How can I trust in what I cannot see?

Person 7 from the center steps forward.

*Brian* Person 7: Jesus taught, "The kingdom of God is not coming in ways that can be observed, <sup>21</sup> nor will they say, 'Look, here it is!' or 'There!' for behold, the kingdom of God is in the midst of you." (Luke 17:20-21). Jesus promised the gift of the Holy Spirit to all believers. This precious gift abiding within us will lead us into all truth, and bring peace to our hearts in times of doubt and uncertainty

Persons 18 and 19 move to the center, nodding thoughtfully.

### **Dialogue #7: Unity with God**

Persons 20 and 21 step forward.

*Hannah* Person 20: We feel separated from God. How can we be united with Him?

Person 21: How do we know if the spirits we encounter are from God?

Person 1 steps forward again.

*Zack* Person 1: Jesus prayed, "That they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me." (John 17:21). We test the spirits we face through the witness of the Holy Spirit within us because He only testifies of the truth found in Jesus Christ. This reassurance can only come as we walk in the Spirit every day. (Galatians 5:16)

Persons 20 and 21 move to the center, nodding thoughtfully.

All participants gather in choir formation at the centre and sing: O Come, All Ye Faithful

**\*\*Note:** This script includes 21 speaking roles for youth and adult members, each delivering one line. The children participate by joining in the final hymn, enhancing the sense of community and inclusion. The entire presentation is designed to fit within a 10-minute timeframe, allowing for smooth transitions and the hymn at the end.
